With support provided by our Information Technologist, the Instructors will use blended-delivery teaching models that include on-line lectures and will engage, mentor and support our students to achieve their education goals for new beginnings. The Instructor will also adhere to the administrative requirements of Oshki-Wenjack and partner institutions.

Social Service Worker - Native Specialization Program Fall 2018: Available Courses

NSA135 Anishinaabemowin Conversational

This course will concentrate on conversation key sentences, to use at work or social setting. The double vowel method is used. The four language skills: listening, speaking, writing and reading will be incorporated for each lesson. There will be a variety of activities and interaction with other students. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in an atmosphere that is both entertaining and educational, thus giving a sense of pride in learning this beautiful language and culture. A portion of the course lessons will be the basic Medicine Wheel Teachings. Our goal is to regain and retain Anishinaabemowin language and culture.

NSW214 Incorporating Indigenous Healing Methods into Practice

Through an experiential learning approach, students will explore how to incorporate Indigenous healing methods in social service work practice. Throughout the semester, students will be exposed to different traditional healing methods within Indigenous cultures including the use of medicines, ceremonies, sharing circles, and traditional healers to achieve spiritual, mental, physical and emotional balance. This course involves hands on experience with medicines and instruction on how to use traditional teachings with clients.
